2024 Legislative Session

- What were we thinking might happen this session?
 - Shorter session-not much will happen
 - There would be technical fixes to certain bills
 - Bonding bill would be the focus
 - There might be another budget surplus



2024 Legislative Session

- What did happen?
 - SRO fix happened
 - Budget surplus-\$2.3 billion, mostly one time funds (\$510 m overall allocated, Education-\$43 m one time funds in FY 25, \$50 m in 2023 reserved budget to expand VPK slots from 7,160 to 12,360
 - Bumpy at the end with a senator accused of an alleged crime
 - Session went right up until midnight on the last day
 - A Bonding Bill did not pass

Key Legislative Policy Provisions!

Academics

- 1. Statewide Health Standards created through rule-making
- Delayed Civics Graduation Requirement

 Incoming 9th grade students, 2025-2026
 - a. Incoming Juligiade 5 Deminder
- 3. Reminder
 - a. Personal Finance (incoming 2024-2025 9th graders)

Flexible Learning Year Applications

- Guidelines for applications
- Six year approval required



Key Legislative Policy Provisions Cont...

- Cyber Security Incident Reporting Required
- Expansion of Food Service Fund Lunchroom Furniture
- Pension Reform: Normal retirement age change effective July 1, 2024. Removal of earnings limitation continued for three additional years
- Unscheduled student removal from class (Lincoln's Law)
- Paid Student Teaching Pilot Program



Key Legislative Policy Provisions Cont...

- Expanded MA billing for School Social Workers
- Paid leave for all employees when school closures claimed as instructional days
- For 2024-2025 Paraprofessional training reduced from 8-6 hours
- School districts must create a Language Access Plan



Key Legislative Policy Provisions Cont...

- Teacher and Paraprofessional Compensation
- Curriculum and intervention recommendations associated with the READ Act for students who are deaf, deaf-blind, and hard of hearing
 - Paraprofessional Qualifications



The READ Act

Increased flexibility

- One year delay for training of Phase I staff (July 1, 2026)
- Literacy Leads can become "Certified Trained Facilitators"
- Option to reduce instructional hours by 5 and ½ hours for Grades 1-3, 2024-2025
- > Expanded use of Literacy Incentive Aid funds
 - Substitutes, Teacher Stipends, Screeners, Employing Intervention Specialists





Additional Changes

- Clarity-which support staff and volunteers need training
- School districts with EC programs must provide approved training to EC staff
- Review of curriculum materials
 - Final review of previously submitted curricula by March 3, 2025
 - MDE may conduct another review must decide by June 1, 2026
 - ➤ Comprehensive review starting in 2033





Additional Changes

- New Requirements for School Districts
 - Third screener added (Feb. 15 deadline)
 - Volunteer Training (8 hours max., free to districts)
- PELSB audit of approved teacher training programs
- MDE must identify 15 evidence-based literacy intervention models by November 1, 2025
- MDE must contract with a third party to develop culturally and linguistically responsive materials

The READ Act Cont...

Funding changes

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- Cooperative educational programs included in funding
- Reallocation of \$33 million to districts (\$2,000 or \$39.94 x students served in 2023 enrollment count)
- \$31.75 million in new funding for FY 25 only for teacher compensation for training-**MOU required** (\$2000 or \$36.06 x students served in 2023 enrollment count)
 - Eligible uses, but not limited to, stipends, payments based on teachers' hourly rate of pay and hours necessary to complete the training
