What can ABA be used for?

ABA can be used to address the following:

- Decrease problem behaviors
- Increase skills such as academics, communication, self-care skills, etc.
- Implement/develop preventative strategies
- Implement/develop reinforcement strategies
- Training educators, paraprofessionals and professional staff

Common Question

"I have a student that is not making progress on his IEP goals and I'm not sure what to do next. Is he at his max learning potential?"

Common Question
